M.A.S.C. offers an outstanding leadership training and development workshop for students who will be in grades 7 – 12 grades. The workshop is held from Sunday, June 5 and concludes on Friday, June 10 on the beautiful campus of William Woods University in Fulton, MO.

The workshop is staffed by adult advisors from around the state, who are considered experts in the area of student leadership. The adults, are assisted by Junior Counselors. The JC's are carefully selected from many applications of students who have previously attended camp. It is the goal of each staff member to assist the students to grow and gain the most from their workshop experience.

The daily schedule includes large group lectures, videos, and presentations. The students are divided into "Councils" which are led by the adult staff and assisted by the Junior Counselors. Topics included in the curriculum are organization, meeting skills, decision-making, problem solving, project planning, project and activity ideas, communication skills, group dynamics and inter-personal relations. Evening activities include the "Olympics," songfest, banquet, and Achievement Night, dance.

Recreation time is provided each day. The campus facilities include, tennis courts and a gymnasium.

SOME girls are housed in air-conditioned dorms. If the registration numbers exceed the number of air-conditioned rooms, some girls will be in NON air-conditioned dorms. THIS HAS BEEN THE CASE FOR SEVERAL YEARS. Boys will be in air-conditioned dorms. The dorms are supervised by the adult staff and JC's. Delegates from the same schools are housed in pairs, as much as possible. If you have rooming requests, make them on the registration forms. No changes will be made once the students arrive at camp.

This workshop is open to all Student Council members, grades 7 – 12. This is not a summer recreation camp. It is a workshop! We have a busy schedule and long days. Do not send students who are not up to this task. I especially ask that Junior High/Middle Level advisors evaluate your delegates carefully. 8<sup>th</sup> graders moving to 9<sup>th</sup> grade should not be registered as High School delegates. They have no high school experience, and I have real difficulty putting that age group with Seniors.

The workshop is also open to advisors. If you are new or

need to be re-energized, this workshop is for you! Adults participate in the same program as the students. But, we are offering workshops and pull-out sessions designed especially for the adults. A school delegation does NOT have to be accompanied by an adult advisor. We encourage you to call with questions. This experience will expand your relationship with your students and help you to be a better advisor!

**LEVEL II** – This will be the 23rd year for Level II. If you have **HIGH SCHOOL** students who have attended the workshop as a **HIGH SCHOOL** delegate, we will have a dynamic program just for them!

If you have high school students who attended as a junior high student they should register as a **LEVEL 1** participant.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR SENDING STUDENTS TO SUMMER LEADERSHIP WORKSHOP:

1. Summer Leadership WORKSHOP (aka: Camp or Fulton) is a full week of learning and fun. Each member school may send delegates. There is usually plenty of space available...send several!
2. Adult advisors do NOT have to accompany students to camp; however, there is an Advisors Program and we would love to have you come and join the fun.
3. Complete the online registration form, print the email confirmation, secure the signatures and send it back to Terri for each student you plan to send.
4. A letter will be sent back to each camper approximately one week prior to camp with a packing list and additional information. This includes a health form which must be brought to Fulton with the delegate.
5. Please send a Purchase Order or a SCHOOL DISTRICT check with the registration forms. It is easier for bookkeeping to have ONE check for your delegates.
6. Students will be busy the entire week, they will return to you full of energy, ideas and enthusiasm. They will be given a Summer Leadership Workshop Manual full of information about student council, project planning, group processing and ideas.
7. A service project is part of the workshop. Campers will receive information about the project in their mailing.
