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Honor **C**ouncil is an opportunity to recognize the excellent work of your council. This program recognizes outstanding student councils and their work across our state. Schools are asked to complete an application in January and return it to Karen Haak.

The application requires schools to have membership paid by December 31, 2011 and attend the state convention in March. You must have a constitution and democratic election and send at least two pictures of any one activity. Other requirements include a checklist of choices ranging from spirit activities, community service, doing a workshop at district or state meeting, running for office, belonging to NASC, providing a leadership training session of officers, and many, many more.

There are two levels of award: Gold and Silver. Schools can opt for either level and still receive State recognition. The awards are presented at State Convention and each school receives a plaque or year plate.

Applications will **ONLY** be available on the website this year—**NO** postal mail applications will be sent.
